"Troll Talk" By Kris Rowley

Kris grew up in Cedar Rapids, and has 3 Norwegian grandparents and 1 Swedish grandparent. Three branches immigrated from Scandinavia around 1900, the other came in the 1850s.

Kris grew up loving fairy tales of all countries, but especially the ones from her ancestral homelands, and the ones involving trolls – a strange element in any tale. Troll tales were particularly violent and unexpectedly intertwined with Christian symbols. The battle lines between good and evil were clear. So, she read and thought and collected their literature, their drawings and their carved images.

Talking about trolls became a hobby that Kris picked up along the way. For her "real" job,

she is the County Treasurer in Dickinson County. She's also done some free-lance writing. She attended Luther College, but graduated from Coe College in Cedar Rapids, with a biology major.

Kris and her husband Dave are the parents of 4 children, the youngest just graduated from the University of Iowa. As children, they grew up listening to troll stories and remain on guard when near forests, mountains or bridges. They also believe they were visited by the fossegrimen when young.

Rowley is looking forward to sharing Norwegian troll folklore with *Solglimt* Lodge, along with her troll collection. These tales were told by a people who believed wits were the key to survival in a place hostile to humankind. But their stories were also influenced by Christianity and show a belief that true strength included kindness and faith.

Editor Gloria Tehven requested news for the next issue of the *Posten* no later than February 4th.

Keith will also follow up on suggestions made for filling the Assistant Social Director positions that are currently open.

Jon reported that the Lodge website is being worked on and is nearly completed per his contact with the webmaster. He also reported that the 2018 Lodge Directory will be ready for distribution at the January meeting. As International President, he will install the Lodge's 2018 officers that morning.

Due to a meeting date mix-up, the program on trolls will be given in February and **Summer Gracey** will report on her studies abroad in Norway at the January *Frokost*.

The secretary and treasurer are preparing their year-end reports for International Headquarters.

February 6th, Sami National Holiday

The Sami people are indigenous to the arctic areas of Norway, Sweden, Finland and Russia. Many Sami make a living in reindeer husbandry and fishing. Nature is very important to the Sami.

The Sami have not always had an easy life in Norway. At the end of the 1800s the Norwegian government required everyone to conform to the Norwegian way of life. However, attitudes changes by the mid-1950s, and Norwegian authorities recognized the importance of maintaining the Sami culture and Norway now embraces the Sami language, traditions, and culture.

February 6th is recognized as Sami National Holiday in all four countries. This day, since 1993, has become a popular event and a time for the indigenous Sami people to celebrate their identity.
