Ice! Everyone, bring ice! Bring cubes in plastic bags. This saves lots of money! We need ice to keep the water and pop cold, plus some food items.

Directions for Packaging Food

Use sandwich size zip-lock bags.

Bars: cut into 2 ½ inch squares, 1 per bag.

Cookies: Large, 1 per bag
Medium, 2 per bag

Kringla, Krumkake: Large, 1 per bag
Medium, 2 per bag

Breads: Bake in a small loaf pan, wrap in plastic wrap

Puff Pastry, coffee cakes, cinnamon rolls:
These will be cut, packaged at the booth.

Use nonreturnable containers. Put your name on your package so we know who made the contribution! Bring items to the booth by 11 A.M. Fri., 10 A.M. Sat., and 10 A.M. Sun., except Cinnamon Rolls are needed earlier. Waverly members, contact **Jon** or **Joel** to drop off food contributions if you need help delivering them.

Other Booth Information

We will have a special on cinnamon rolls Sunday morning. We need about 6 dozen more rolls. If members in Waverly can make rolls and/or need help with delivery, call **Joel** or **Chris Johnson, 319-483-5071**.

We need an 18 quart roaster to use for the pulled pork preparation. Contact the **Johnsons** if you have one we can use. The pulled pork will be provided by Chandler's Janesville Locker this year. It has a minimum amount of sauces so the pork flavor really comes out. We will have sauces available at the booth.

This year's sausage will be made by Clements out of Milwaukee. These are low in fat, have no MSG and are gluten free. And taste better!

We just celebrated Memorial Day, honoring the people in the military who have served in American Armed Services, to protect our freedom. On August 12, 2017, the 99th Infantry Battalion (Separate) will be holding the 75th Anniversary of its creation at Camp Ripley, MN. The 99th Battalion, also called the Viking Battalion, was made up of Norwegian Americans who could speak fluent Norwegian and could ski, as well as Norwegian seaman who were left without a place to go when Germany invaded Norway.

Sons of Norway is looking for any member of our lodge who may have served in this battalion, or who may have any information about the battalion.
