Borlaug Farm Visit

Joanne Lane noted some errors in last month's report on the Lodge trip to the Borlaug Farm and to **Joanne's** house where we had coffee. Here is her information.

- 1. Though our farm has been in the Nelson family since 1883, I did not grow up where we had coffee. The "original" Nelson farm is one mile east of our farm. My sister, Hazel Nelson Braniger, lives on that farm. Perhaps you noticed the two large red barns, the nicely maintained farm that is on the south side of the road...Our farm was built by an uncle in the 1940s and we purchased it from my father, Norman Nelson, in the 1970s.
- 2. Our house is new construction, built in 2008. A contractor did the major construction, while Roger has done the finish work—is working on the finishing and varnishing—I do the painting. There was a painting of the original house on the wall by the stairway to the loft. It had been built in the mid1880s and replaced on the Nelson farm in 1911. When my uncle built his farm (now ours) he simply pulled the "original house" that was being used as a pump shed, one mile down the road, remodeled it and brought his new bride home to it in the 1940s. As true Scandinavians, we never throw anything usable away!
