Duane Lindberg "The Mysterious Disappearance of the Norse Settlements in Greenland"



Dr. Lindberg's program will focus on the mystery of the disappearance of the Norse colony in western Greenland. This colony was founded by Erik the Red @984 A. D. It thrived for 300 years; however, it mysteriously disappeared @1342. The report of an expedition sent by the King of Norway/Sweden in 1355 to find the lost colony helps to explain the mystery of the Kensington Rune Stone discovered near Alexandria, MN in 1897.

Thanksgiving Trivia

<u>Fact or Fiction</u>: One of America's Founding fathers thought the turkey should be the national bird of the United States.

Fact: In a letter to his daughter sent in 1784, Benjamin Franklin suggested that the wild turkey would be a more appropriate national symbol for the newly independent United States than the bald eagle (which had earlier been chosen by the Continental Congress.) He argued that the turkey was a "a much more respectable bird," "a true original native of America," and "though a little vain & silly, a Bird of Courage."

Fact or Fiction: Turkeys are slow-moving birds that lack the ability to fly.

Fiction (kind of): Domesticated turkeys (the type eaten on Thanksgiving Day) cannot fly, and their pace is limited to a slow walk. Female domestic turkeys, which are typically smaller and lighter than males, can move somewhat faster. Wild turkeys, on the other hand, are much smaller and more agile. They can reach speeds of up to 20-25 miles per hour on the ground and fly for short distances at speeds approaching 55 miles per hour. They also have better eyesight and hearing than their domestic counterparts.
