Secretary's Notes, September 3, 2019 Business Meeting

Solglimt's monthly business meeting was called to order by **President Keith Jorgensen** on Tuesday, September 3, at his residence in Cedar Falls with **Gloria Tehven, Dottie Roiseland, Jon Tehven** and **Eunice Becker** attending.

The secretary's minutes were approved as written (**Jon/Dottie**).

Treasurer Jim Miller reported via e-mail receipts of \$489.40 (June) and \$5,855.30 (July/Aug.) and disbursements of \$1,082 (June) and \$3,072.82 (July/Aug.) leaving a balance of \$5,789.37 in the Lodge operating account as of the end of August. Treasurer's report accepted (**Jon/Dottie**).

Lodge membership stands at 101 according to Home Office figures.

Editor Gloria Tehven reported that the September newsletter is a work in progress. She requested reports and news items for the next issue by October 1st (later extended to the 4th.)
