Secretary's Notes, March 3, 2020 Business Meeting

Solglimt's monthly business meeting was called to order on Tuesday, March 3, by President Clare Palmer at New Aldaya in Cedar Falls. Present were Jon Tehven, Jim Miller, Duane Lindberg and Eunice Becker.

The Secretary's Minutes of the February meeting were approved as written.

Treasurer Jim Miller reported a balance of \$4,057.05 in the Lodge operating account with receipts of \$651.40 and disbursements of \$832.31 for the month of February. He also noted that **Mike Butler** and **Dave Palmer** would be conducting an audit of the Lodge's 2019 financial records on Thursday, March 5. Treasurer's report accepted.

The Secretary reported that the yearly Lodge Activity Report had been completed and filed electronically. The Treasurer's year-end report will be filed once the audit has been completed.

Jon Tehven reported a new member had joined the Lodge. Membership stands at 98 to date. **Jon** will update Lodge attendance and report to the Board monthly via email in an effort to improve member retention.

Establishing a central location for storing the Lodge archives was discussed. They are now being held by the various officers.

Duane Lindberg presented a listing of possible strategic Planning objectives for discussion and consideration. The Lodge logo redesign remains a work in progress.

Plans are underway for the Lodge observance of the 45th anniversary of its charter. Charter Members will share memories from that year –1945 –at the April Lodge meeting. (Due to COVID-19 the meeting has been cancelled.)

A policy for the decision to cancel a Lodge meeting due to inclement weather was considered and adopted.

Action on speaker honorariums and gratuity for the CFWC staff was delayed for further input.

Lodge goals were revisited and will come under further discussion at a later date.

Jon shared information with the Lodge's delegates to the District Convention regarding registration which can be submitted online. (District Convention has been cancelled.)

Next business meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 7, at noon, preceded by lunch at 11:30. There is another Lodge activity on that date that may require a change in meeting day. (Lodge activity – attending play – cancelled, as was Culture Fest.)

Next Lodge meeting celebrating the Lodge's 45th Anniversary takes place Tuesday, April 28. (Cancelled)

Solglimt Has a Connection with the Youth Olympic Games!

The Norwegian Youth Olympic Team won several gold medals at the 2020 Youth Olympic Games at Lausanne, Switzerland in January. Among the gold medal winners was the mixed Nordic Combine team (ski jumping and a cross-country relay). The Norwegian team finished one minute and 19.3 seconds ahead of the second-place team from Austria.

The mixed team has three boys and three girls. Ski jumping initiates the competition and the results determine the starting positions for the 4 x 3.3 km cross-country relay. Because the Norwegian team had an outstanding showing in the ski jumping, they started the cross-country relay with a 12 second lead and had no trouble winning the race more than a minute ahead of the second-place Austrian team.

Solglimt's connection with Norway's Youth Olympic team is that Nora Midsunstad, one the of Nordic Combined team members, is a granddaughter of **Duane Lindberg's** cousin. She is from *Vaaler, Hedemarken,* Norway. Nora is 17 years old and one of a growing number of Norwegian young women who are risking the dangers of ski jumping. However, to date, the International Winter Olympics Committee has not allowed women's ski jumping as an Olympic sport.

Solglimt Lodge 1-547, Organized April 22, 1975 From a History of District 1, Sons of Norway, Centennial Edition, 1895-1995 Part 3

Two hundred fifty eight became charter members. At a later date, the name Solglynt was submitted by Chsoldvar Woods. Geraldine Hanson wrote the University of Oslo about the name and they suggested it be spelled Solglimt, which means "glimpse of the sun." This name and spelling was approved. Iver Loe, 90, born in Norway, was our oldest member. The youngest member was Diane Stensland.

At the time of organization, no permanent meeting place had been established. A few members suggested some of the meetings be held in Waterloo. Waterloo meetings were held at the Five Sullivan Brothers Convention Center, the Recreation Center, and Central High School.

Cedar Falls meetings were held at the Commons, Peet Junior High, and the Utilities Building. None of these locations were adequate. Levern Narveson was delegated to find and make arrangements for a permanent meeting place, which he did with the Cedar Falls Woman's Club. This proved to be an ideal location, as it had ample nearby parking, easy access, room to seat 125, a stage, screen, piano, public address system, and a kitchen that served meals. Narveson said that people love to eat out, so monthly meetings are held with a sit down dinner. The lodge has always felt that this contributed greatly to the good attendance.

In 1976 our country celebrated its bicentennial. At this time Cedar Falls, which was called Sturgis Falls in its early years, began the celebration known today as Sturgis Falls Days. The celebration is held yearly, the last part of June. Virginia Stensland, Social Director, attended numerous meetings with city officials in preparation for Solglimt's part in the event. It was decided to have a food both, which was constructed by Amos Hagenson and his committee. The booth featured Norwegian foods, such as pulsa, lefse, kringla, krumkake, fattigmann, and rosettes. The revenue from the sale of foods at this yearly event has been the main source of income for the lodge.

The Sturgis Falls parade features various floats by organizations in Cedar Falls. Solglimt once won the Governor's trophy at the parade.

Solglimt has made generous contributions to Vesterheim, the Norwegian-American museum in Decorah, lowa and has supported projects and organizations in the local communities. Members of the lodge have conducted classes in Hardanger, rosemaling, language, baking, and cooking.

All of these activities have been very helpful in making our Norwegian heritage known in the area.

Some lodge members have been in a position to contribute more than others. However, everyone who attends the meetings has made a contribution to the success of Solglimt #547.

REIDAR DITTMANN

Reidar Dittmann was born in Tonsberg, Norway, where he graduated from the gymnasium. He studied at Oslo University, Oslo Music Conservatory, St. Olaf College, and the University of Washington. He hold a Bachelors of Music, a Masters Degree and a Doctor of Philosophy.

During World War II he was a member of the Norwegian Resistance movement (1940-1942) and was imprisoned in Norway and in Buchenwald concentration camp in Germany (1942-1945).

Dittmann has authored several books on Edvard Munch, Edvard Grieg, and the Holocaust.

He has been recognized by Phi Beta Kappa, the National Endowment for Humanities, the Jewish Community Relations Award, the St. Olav Medal awarded by the King of Norway, and is listed in Who is Who in America. His biography is included among Gentile Survivors in the National Holocaust Museum.

Besides his distinguished teaching career at St. Olaf College, he has lectured throughout the USA, Europe, and Asia on the Holocaust, as well as topics related to Europe, especially Scandinavian art.


