We begin 2021 with bated breaths. Will it be an improvement over the last year or will we be faced with additional surprises or challenges?




January 2020

Secretary's Notes, December 15, 2020 Business Meeting

President Clare Palmer called *Solglimt's* monthly business meeting to order on Tuesday, December 15, at New Aldaya in Cedar Falls with **Keith Jorgensen, Jim Miller, Jon Tehven, Gloria Tehven** and **Eunice Becker** attending.

November's meeting notes were approved as written. (**Jon/Keith**).

Treasurer Jim Miller reported a balance of \$4,502.24 in the Lodge operating account as of November 30, with receipts of \$135.40 and disbursements of \$207.24 for the month. Treasurer's report accepted and placed on file.

A donation will be sent to the 1st District Scholarship Trust Fund in memory of **Howard Braden** who passed away on November 13.

Jim shared correspondence from the new owner of the facility where the Lodge Viking ship float is stored. No changes are anticipated. He also shared a thank you letter from the Sons of Norway Foundation for the Lodge contribution of \$500 to the October Matching Fund.

Jon Tehven reviewed the November Activity Report which listed Lodge membership at 86.

Editor Gloria Tehven conducted a drawing of names of those who had contributed content to the POSTEN from September – December. The winners of a plaque depicting the Nativity were **Ron and Sharon Lance**.

Winners of wooden ornaments were **Dottie Roiseland, Bev Haugen, Hovey Brom** and **Don Meyer**. All items were *rosemaled* by **Gloria**.



In addition to reports and news items, **Gloria** invites members to continue sending in their stories, jokes, family history of observations for publication in the newsletter. The deadline for the next issue is January 1, 2021.

Old Business

The redesign of the Lodge Logo has been tabled for the time being.

Members are encouraged to maintain contact with others by telephone or call to stay in touch.

Having determined that the current Lodge officers are willing to extend their terms in office for another year, the current slate will remain the same in 2021.

New Business

Jon reported that the 2021 Yearbook is nearing completion and will be ready for publication before the year is ended.

Budgeted year-end donations were reviewed and approved (**Keith/Jon**). They include the Danish American Museum, NAGC-NL, Vesterheim, NAHA and Ski for Light. An amendment to include newsletter, yearbook and web page expenses was also approved.

Revised Lodge By-laws were also reviewed and will be presented to the members by **Jon** at a future Lodge meeting (date undetermined). A vote will be taken at a following meeting.

A review of Lodge Policies and Procedures will be taken up at a future business meeting. No revisions have been made since February, 1997.

The next business meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, January 12, at New Aldaya. Lunch at 11:30; meeting at noon.

Due to COVID guidelines, no *Frokost* is planned for January.

As there was no further business, meeting adjourned.

A Little History about Norway’s National Anthem, *Ja, Vi Elsker*

Rikard Nordraak, together with the poet Bjørnstjerne Bjørnson, were responsible for the words and music of “*Ja, Vi Elsker*”.



Nordraak was born on June 12, 1842 in Christiania. His family had a piano and Rikard started playing early. In 1850, his cousin, Bjørnstjerne, who was in town to study, moved in with his relatives.

Bjørnstjerne observes that the young boy has musical talent.



The lyrics for “*Ja, Vi Elsker*” were written by Bjørnstjerne. When the poem needed to be set to music for the Constitutional Jubilee in 1864, Bjørnstjerne, of course, gave the assignment to his dear cousin, Rikard.

The first official performance took place at the Jubilee on May 17, 1864. The men’s choir conductor said that at the first rehearsal “the song was immediately beloved and that everyone felt: ‘Now, this is our national anthem!’ “

The timing was perfect. It was said, “*Ja, Vi Elsker*” inhaled the breath of an entire people, a few decades prior to Norway becoming independent. It quickly became a “national anthem” by virtue of its popularity. At 21 years old, Rikard Nordraak had managed something incredible.

In November of 1865 Nordraak contacted pneumonia. After five months of illness, surrounded by doctors and his landlord, he died on March 10, 1866. Although we can later read about him, his funeral was unnoticed, and is a testament to a lonely young man. Two people showed up at the funeral procession: his landlord and a friend.

In the 20th century, Nordraak’s ideas gained new relevance when Norway became independent. He is honored with memorials in Berlin, Copenhagen, and Oslo, and his urn was moved to The Cemetery of Our Savior in Oslo in 1925.

In December 2019, “*Ja, Vi Elsker*” was officially voted Norway’s national anthem by the Storting, after having been in use for over 150 years!



(Ed. Note: I don’t know the source of this article—it was in my newsletter file without any source mentioned. Some of you may know that when our lodge was first organized, they wanted to be called the Elsker Lodge. Sons of Norway objected—they thought being called the “love” Lodge wouldn’t be a good idea. *Solglimt* was selected instead—a glimpse of the sun is a good name. I love to see the sun shining!!)
