Both the Secretary's Minutes (Jon/Gloria) and Treasurer's Report (Jim/Jon) were approved. Treasurer Miller reported a balance of \$3,524.41 in the Lodge operating account at the end of March with receipts of \$506.57 and disbursements of \$668.40. Plans are in place for this year's Culture Fest at the Waterloo Center for the Arts on Thursday, April 4th.

As dinner was served, **Sunshine Chair Bev Haugen** reported on her activities during the month.

Jon Tehven spoke on the Lodge's volunteer opportunities with the Northeast Iowa Food Bank and circulated a sign-up sheet for those interested in participating.

Those celebrating April birthdays were acknowledged.

With this year's Sturgis Falls celebration only 60 days away, **Coordinator Joel Johnson** had sign-up sheets for volunteers to provide staffing and pastries for the Lodge booth and help with the Viking ship. Cash donations to help with expenses are always welcome.

Social Director Clare Palmer introduced the evening's program presenter Bruce Bjorgum who spoke on the activation by the War Department in 1942 of the 99th Infantry Battalion (Separate) and its service during WWII. With the aid of videos and still photographs, Bjorgum narrated the story of this

elite group of Norwegian nationals and Norwegian-Americans with a working knowledge of the Norwegian language and, preferably, knowing how to ski. He told of their training at Camp Ripley in Minnesota and in the mountains of Colorado, eventually serving on the battle fields of Europe.



Mr. Bjorgum's interest in the story of the 99th Battalion was sparked in his youth by attending reunions of the group with his father in the years following the war. Robert Thorsten Bjorgum had served in that Viking Battalion. His son now serves as Secretary of the Battalion's Educational Foundation, founded to share the story of the 99th and to honor its members.

In closing, **Jon Tehven** told of the 75th anniversary dinner of the 99th Battalion that he and **Gloria** attended at Camp Ripley in 2017, at which he presented a plaque on behalf of Sons of Norway, honoring the Battalion's service.

Hovey Brom also shared some moving remarks of his service in World War II.



Videos and books were available for purchase following the meeting.

A basket was circulated for cash donations to the Food Bank. Money collected this month and last month will be matched by a grant from an anonymous donor.

Congratulations to **Audrey Fimreite**, winner of the drawing for a Lodge dinner.

Sturgis Falls Celebration food packaging requirements:

- --Use Zip-Lock bags of appropriate size.
- --Bars: cut into 2 ½ inch squares, 1 per bag
- --Cookies: 3" or larger, 1 per bag/ 1"-2", 2 per bag
- --Kringla, Krumkake: large, 1 per bag; medium, 2 per bag
- --Breads: bake in small loaf pans, use plastic wrap
- --Puff Pastry, Coffee Cake, Cinnamon Rolls; We will cut at the booth.
- --Use non-returnable containers. Put your name on them so we can list your contribution and check your name off the list.

Bring your items to the booth in Overman Park, Third and Clay Streets by 11:00 AM Friday, 10 AM on Saturday, and 10:00 AM on Sunday.

We welcome kids and grandkids to help in the booth, However, the Cedar Falls Sturgis Falls committee requires them to be 14 years old or older to participate.

In order to provide our Sturgis Falls Sunday morning roll and coffee customers with a good quality roll and fresh ground coffee, we like all of you who contribute rolls to use the Rhodes brand of frozen cinnamon rolls. You can find them in most grocery stores. The cinnamon rolls need to be at the booth by 8 am on Sunday, or you can bring them any time on Saturday.

They are easy to make. Just place them in a pan (use disposable aluminum pans), place them in the oven to rise overnight (10 hours or so) and bake them. They present just like a roll from your favorite bakery. You don't need to frost them as we can do that at the booth on Sunday morning.

A little history of the day: The Constitution of Norway was signed at Eidsvoll on May 17, 1814. The Constitution declared Norway to be an independent kingdom in an attempt to avoid being ceded to Sweden after Denmark-Norway's devastating defeat in the Napoleonic Wars.

We can thank the poet Henrik Wergeland with making May 17th a celebratory day. He is credited with giving the first public address on behalf of the National Day, when there was a Royal decree forbidding celebration.
